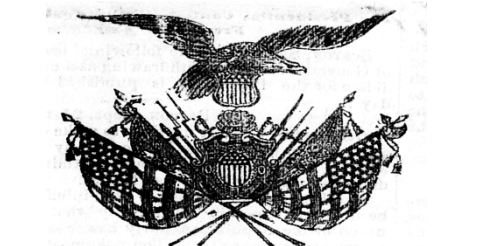

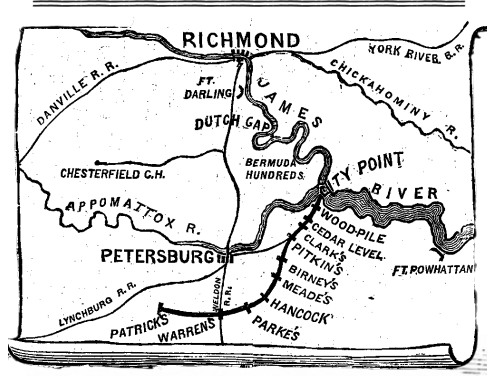
The following telegram from Gen. GRANT has just been received:

CITY POINT, Sept. 3, 1864.

Hon. E. M. Stanton:

I have a Richmond paper of to-day. It contains a rumor of a battle at Atlanta, but says that the War Department, having no official information, it declines to form an opinion from the rumors. I have no doubt, however, but SHERMAN has gained a great success there. Before the dispatch of last night was received, announcing the occupation of Atlanta by our troops the fact was known to our pickets. The rebels hallooed over to our men that SHERMAN had whipped Hood—that the latter had lost 40,000 men, and that our troops were in Atlanta. All quiet here.

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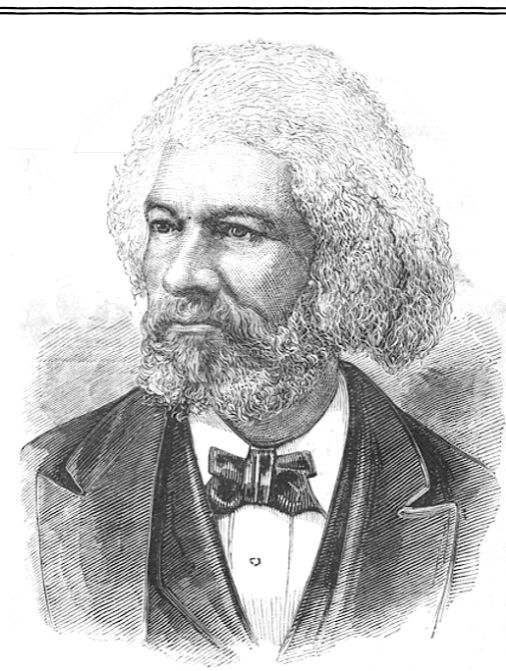
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THE WAR IN CALIFORNIA?

During the war California was a free state -many CALIFORNIAN soldiers volunteered to fight for the Union, and Californian gold and supplies fueled the war effort. At home, there were occasional rumblings of secession, putting local garrisons on high alert. There were acts of sabotage and piracy around the state, and many feared a Rebel invasion. A column of brave Union soldiers even marched from the Pacific Coast, across the treacherous Mojave Desert, and into Arizona to stop the enemy!
